MESSAGE FROM THE PRIME MINISTER



The State of the African Diaspora (SOAD) is an entity *sui generis*, which means it is defined by itself, like the African Union, the European Union, the Vatican, etc. And as it is also a sovereign State, therefore, it does not need to be recognized by others to exist. It exists through its own Constitution, its institutions and its actions.

However, the State of the African Diaspora is not isolated, of course. Its leaders are based in more than 100 countries in the world, and SOAD has with the United Nations, the African Union, the CAFRAD, many countries and kingdoms different kinds of connections, like cooperation agreements, mandates or programs of action, as will be explained in this document.

1) Introduction

Within Africa, there are 5 regions: North Africa, West Africa, Central Africa, East Africa, Southern Africa. In 2003, at the end of the AU Summit, the Heads of State declared (14 (XVIII) add. :

“The African Union (...) decides to recognize the African Diaspora as an effective entity contributing to economic and social development of the continent. “

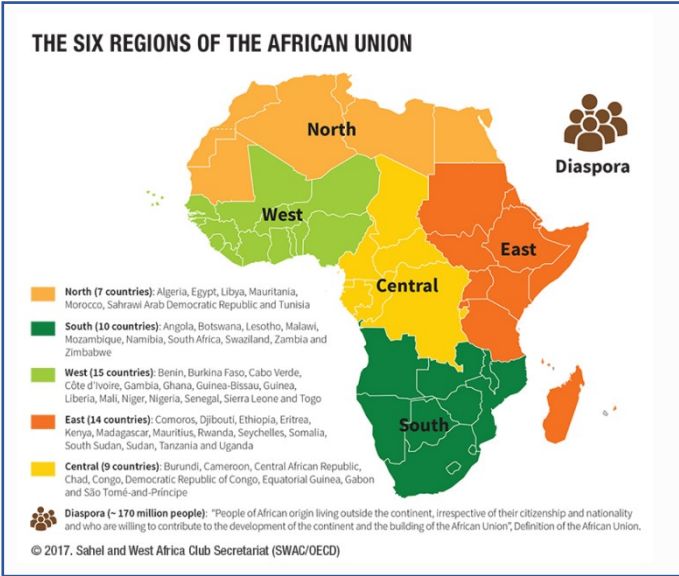
They decided that the Diaspora would be the “Sixth Region” of Africa, which now exists in the constitution of the African Union, and is a region without borders.

But for many years, this “Sixth Region” of the AU existed only on paper. **It was therefore necessary to give substance to this institution, and move from a de facto diaspora to a de jure diaspora.**

In 2014, Mohamed Ould Abdel Aziz, President-in-Office of the African Union gave a mandate to Dr Louis-Georges Tin, chairperson of the CRAN (the French black coalition), to set up the African Diaspora, to “give substance” to the Sixth Region:

“You wished to attract our attention about your project that aims to give substance to the 6th region of the African Union(...). The interview I had with you and the information that we collected about your activities gave me the assurance of the major role the CRAN can play to contribute to the implementation of the programs of development of our Continent. “

Then, with an international team, Dr Louis-Georges Tin formed a Government. On July, 1st, 2018, during the Summit of the African Union, where he was invited by the President



of Mauritania, Dr Louis-Georges Tin launched this initiative : the State of the African Diaspora was borne, a State without borders.

The State of the African Diaspora is not a part of the African Union, has not asked to be recognised by the African Union,

and is independent from it, as it is a sovereign entity. However, Dr Tin received a mandate from the President of the African Union, and SOAD interacts with the African Union, which reinforces its strength.

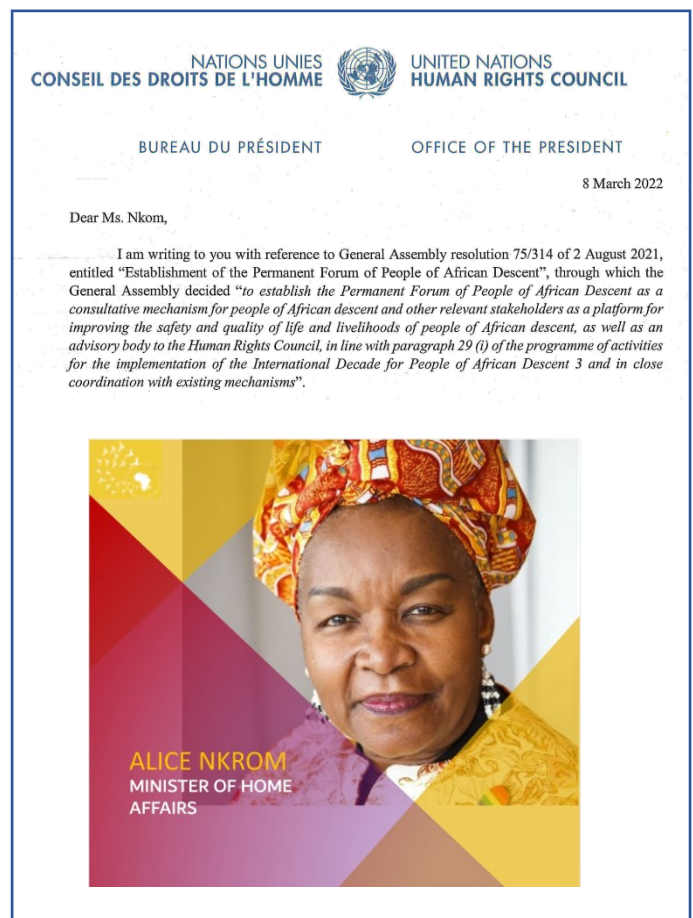
2) Connections with the United Nations

The State of the African Diaspora is not a member of the United Nations, and did not ask to be a member of this Organisation, but is working with the UN on different programs.

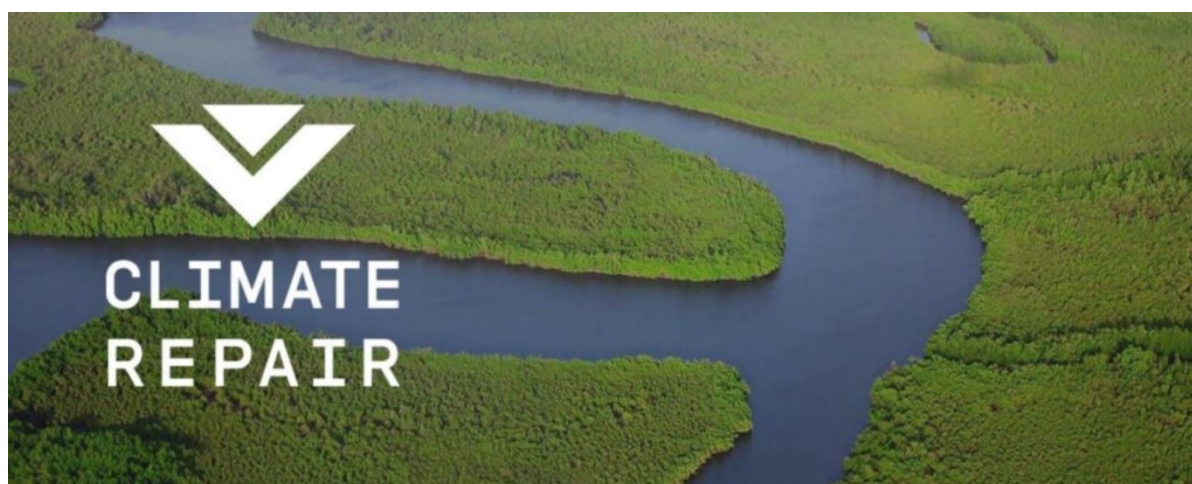


a) The UN Permanent Forum for People of African Descent

In 2021, the Human Rights Council of the United Nations created The Permanent Forum of People of African Descent. The Prime Minister of the State of the African Diaspora wrote to the UN authorities to recommend his Minister of Home Affairs, Mrs Alice Nkom. In 2022, Mrs Nkom was appointed as one of the 10 members of the Forum. Therefore, the State of the African Diaspora has a direct connection with the Forum and the Human Rights Council, and contributes to their programs of action.



b) The Global Constituency of Youth for Environment



In February 2022, the Global Constituency of Youth for Environment, which works under the aegis of the United Nations, honored Salem Ayenan, Dean of the Faculty of Diplomacy of the University of the State of the African Diaspora and Chief of Staff of the Minister of Education.

This UN institution had launched a call for applications for the organization of Local Youth Assemblies for the Environment. It should be recalled that these assemblies are held each year before the UN General Assembly for the Environment, and their mission is to contribute to the work of the UN in this area by making proposals that are presented at the UN General Assembly for the Environment.

Salem Ayenan had applied on behalf of the State of the African Diaspora. On February 10, 2022, he received the following message:



“Dear Mr. Salem Ayenan of the University of the State of the African Diaspora, we congratulate you on your selection to implement the Regional Youth Assembly for the Environment on behalf of the Africa region. Out of more than 200 applications from all countries in Africa, your application was of particular interest to us because of your vision, ideals and experiences.”

c) UN Alliance for Sustainable Development Goals (UNASDG)



On April 5, 2023, the United Nations Alliance for Sustainable Development Goals (UNASDG) and the State of the African Diaspora (SOAD) signed a convention and a cooperation agreement. According to these documents,

"the UNASDG hereby confirms its willingness and intention to enter into long-term cooperation with the State of the African Diaspora, hereinafter referred to as "Diaspora". Likewise, the State of the African Diaspora hereby confirms its willingness and intention to enter into long-term cooperation with the intergovernmental organization UNASDG, and both organizations fully recognize each other as a full sovereign body by signing this Agreement. "

As indicated in the convention, *"the objectives of the cooperation are the smooth implementation and completion of projects and processes at the technical,*

environmental, economic, humanitarian and financial levels within the framework of the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs)"

The SDGs were defined by the United Nations in 2015 and include 17 objectives such as « no poverty », « no hunger », « clean water », « clean energy », « gender equality », « quality education », etc. The State of the African Diaspora is very involved in the SDGs, especially through its program to provide agribusiness and to create 25 smart cities in Africa and in the Diaspora, and is working with the UNASDG to raise financing for these initiatives.

3) Connections with the African Union



a) Mandate from the President of the African Union

In 2014, Dr Louis-Georges Tin who was then the President of the CRAN (the French Black Organisation) received a mandate from His Excellency Mohamed Ould Abdel Aziz, the President of the African Union, to create an entity for the African Diaspora 6th Region.

c) MOU and Observer Status Pan-African Parliament (PAP)

On November 15, 2024, Chief Fortune Charumbira, President of the Parliament of the African Union (PAP), and Dr Louis-Georges Tin, Prime Minister of the State of the African Diaspora (SOAD), signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). Under the terms of this MOU, the following was agreed :

- the State of the African Diaspora is now granted Observer Member Status and will be invited to speak at the commencement of each Ordinary Session;
- a permanent office within Parliament shall be established for the State of the African Diaspora;



- the two Parliaments will keep each other informed of their respective political agendas;
- PAP and SOAD shall celebrate annually the ‘International Day of the African Diaspora’; and
- SOAD and PAP will jointly organise every year the Africa-Diaspora Summit.

a) Cooperation Agreement with the East Africa Climate Legislative Assembly (EACLA)

On August 12, 2025, the State of the African Diaspora (SOAD) signed a Cooperation Agreement with the East Africa Climate Legislative Assembly (EACLA), bringing together parliamentarians from ten East African countries. The agreement promotes legislative cooperation on sustainable development, climate action, and the development of infrastructure aligned with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), strengthening links between Africa and its global diaspora.

b) Connection to CAFRAD



Since June 02, 2022, **the State of the African Diaspora (SOAD)** has officially been part of the Intergovernmental Organization, CAFRAD (“Centre Africain de Formation et de Recherche Administratives pour le Développement”, an IGO including 38 States). As such, SOAD is entitled to sit in the same capacity as the other Member States, on all the statutory bodies of the institution, and will as well participate in the debates on the governance and development of CAFRAD.

Representing the African Diaspora, SOAD automatically integrates the Executive Committee of CAFRAD as the sole representative of the 6th Region of Africa, by virtue of the principle of geographical representation in force within this body.

5) Connection with the WFDP



On December 6, 2022, the State of the African Diaspora signed a cooperation agreement with the World Fund for Development and Planning (WFDP). The WFDP is an Inter-Governmental Organisation that seeks "to monitor the 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) and focus on global partnership as well as on financial governance and access to technology within the African region and to support the implementation of the 2030 Agenda in developing countries through public and private, domestic, and international resources".

The 17 SDG were defined by the United Nations in 2015 to "provide a shared blueprint for a more peaceful, prosperous years sustainable future for all". They include items such as "no poverty", "0 hunger", "good health and wellbeing", "quality education", "gender equality", etc. The SDG are definitely included in the vision of the State of the African Diaspora. They are part of the campaign for climate justice, that SOAD launched in February 2022, in the framework of the COP 27 in Egypt. However, the SDG will be essential also for the smart cities SOAD is working on.

LOUIS-GEORGES TIN, PRIME MINISTER, declare that **STATE OF THE AFRICAN DIASPORA** has the legal capacity to enter into treaties or international agreements and has considered the above-mentioned convention and accepts the same and undertakes faithfully to perform and carry out the stipulations therein contained.

The State of the African Diaspora also has institutional connections with several Nation States.

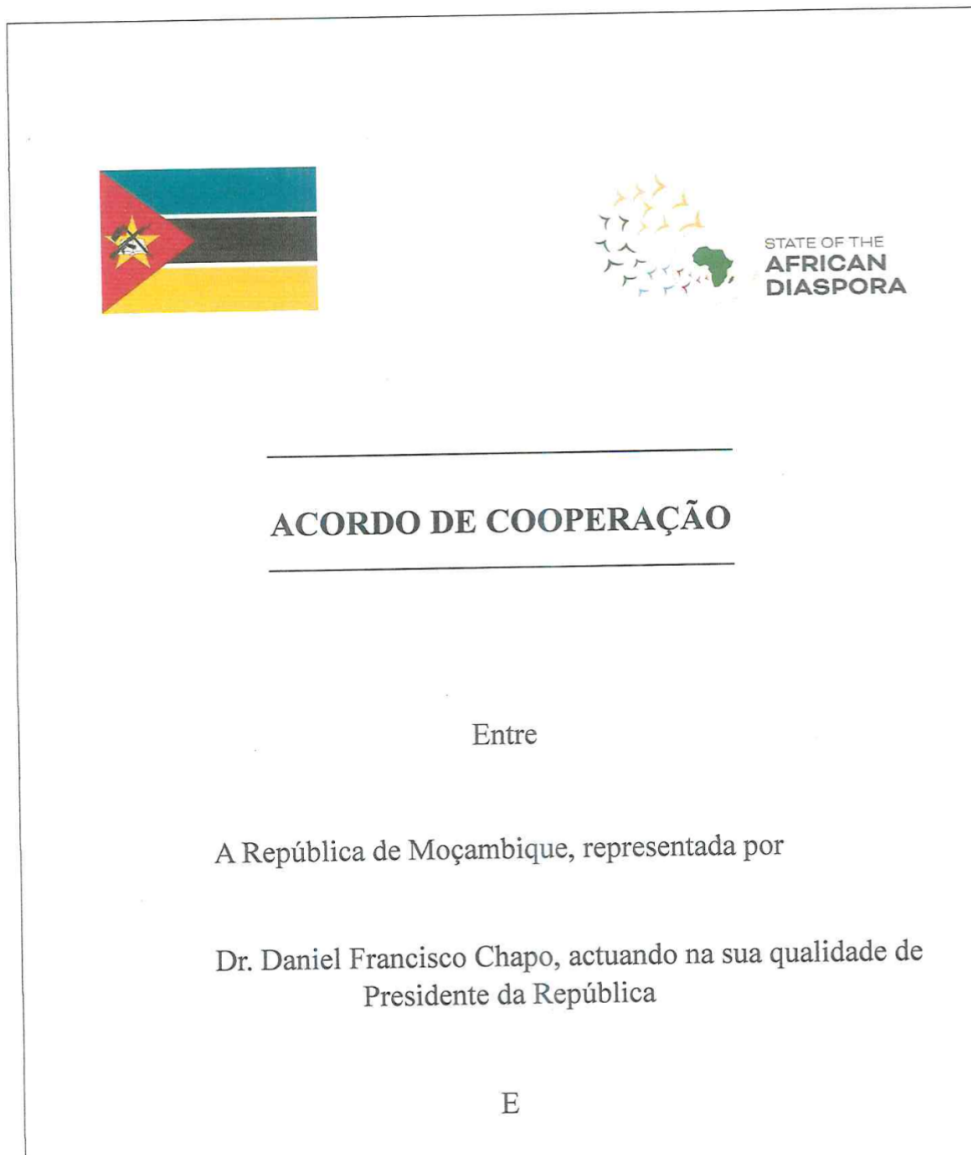

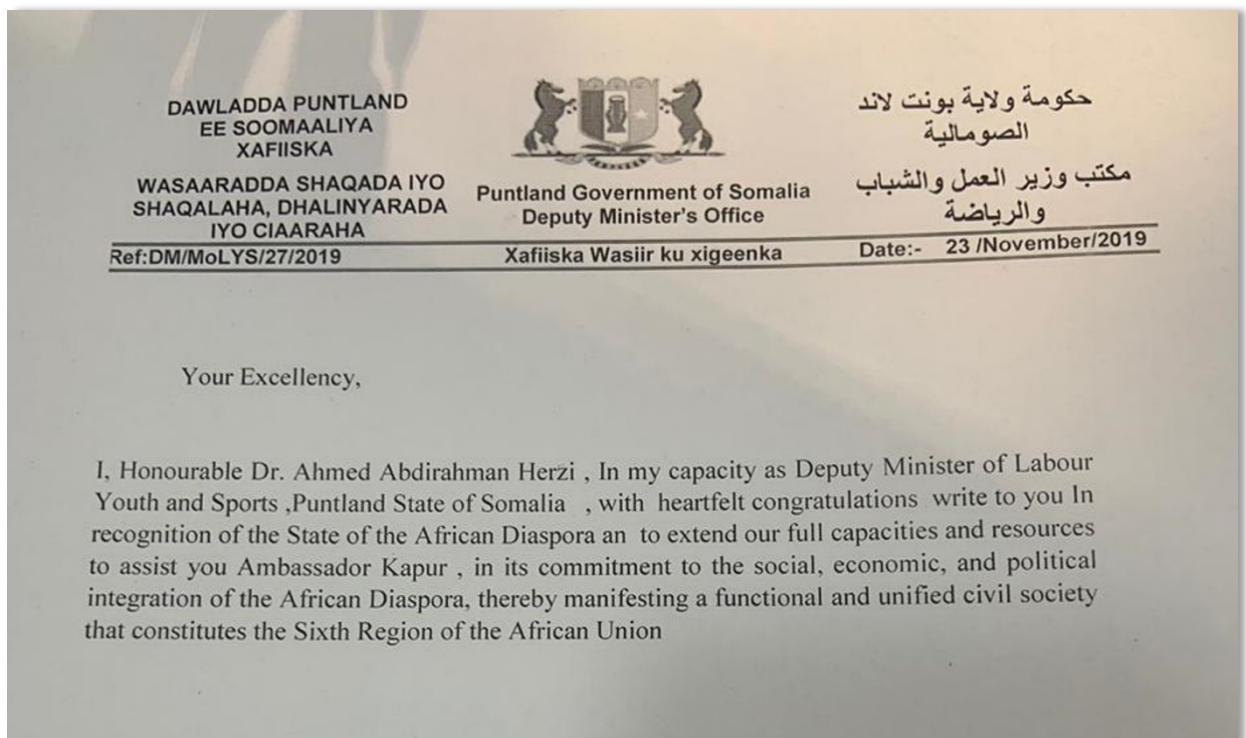


b) Cooperation Agreement with Mozambique

COOPERATION AGREEMENT

The ministry of Youth and Sports is responsible for facilitating Youth and Sports in The Gambia. The core responsibilities of the Ministry we are focused on is creating conducive environment that provides strategic support on producing the right policies that provides strategic support systems, initiatives for personal development, character building, sports policy implementation and community-based youth-led programmes. The ministry coordinates and facilitates two core programs, which is Youth and Sports Development.

f) Mandate from DRC

On 9 October 2019, Mr. Yves Bunkulu-Zola, Minister of Tourism and Culture of the Democratic Republic of the Congo, "granted a mandate to the Government of the State of the African Diaspora, through its Prime Minister, Mr. Louis-Georges Tin, to act on behalf of and for the account of the Ministry of Tourism of the Democratic Republic of the Congo before public and private institutions in the Member States of the European Union in all procedures related to the implementation of legal measures concerning the restitution of the tourism and cultural heritage of the Democratic Republic of the Congo."

On the basis of this mandate, the Prime Minister of SOAD undertook extensive advocacy efforts which contributed to the adoption of several legislative and policy instruments in support of the restitution of African cultural heritage.

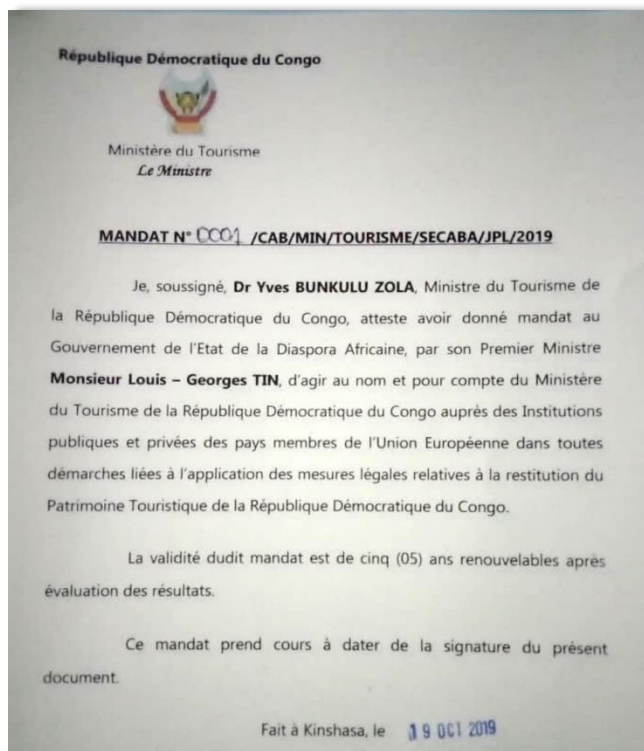

g) Mandate from Benin

In 2017, Mr. Ange N'Koué, Minister of Tourism and Culture of the Republic of Benin, entrusted Louis-Georges Tin with a mandate to work on restitution issues on behalf of the Government of Benin. At the time, Mr. Tin was serving as President of CRAN (Conseil Représentatif des Associations Noires de France – Representative Council of Black Associations of France).

When he became Prime Minister of the State of the African Diaspora (SOAD) in 2018, Mr. Tin was encouraged to continue his cooperation with the Republic of Benin. After his efforts contributed to the return of the Royal Treasures of Benin, he was invited to Cotonou by President Patrice Talon, who received him at the Presidential Palace and personally expressed his gratitude on behalf of the Beninese people.

c) Cooperation Agreement with Kasai Central Province (DRC)

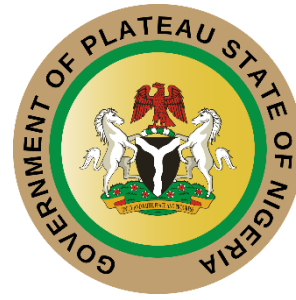

PREAMBLE

Considering that the African Diaspora is an entity which was recognized by the African Union, in Addis Ababa (Ethiopia), on February 3, 2003, and by the 2nd ordinary session of the Conference of Heads of State of the African Union in Maputo (Mozambique), July 11, 2003,

Whereas the State of the African Diaspora aims to strengthen Africa through the Diaspora, and the Diaspora through Africa,

Whereas Nanny Town, Portland Maroon Territories, Island of Jamaica.

Conscious of the need to develop cooperation between the Maroon Council of Nanny Town and the State of the African Diaspora in a Pan-African framework,

d) Cooperation Agreement with National Council of Rural Parish Governments of Imbabura (CONAGOPARE-I), Ecuador



On October 31, 2025, the State of the African Diaspora signed a strategic cooperation agreement with the National Council of Rural Parish Governments of Imbabura (CONAGOPARE-I), Ecuador.

Under this agreement, CONAGOPARE Imbabura will provide a diplomatic mission in Ecuador to the State of the African Diaspora, serving as a coordination center for joint projects. Both parties will work together on the creation of a smart city, integrating modern infrastructure, educational and medical facilities, as well as clean energy solutions. The agreement also provides for enhanced cooperation in sustainable agriculture, community health, and cultural development.

9) Connections with Kingdoms



On July 1st, the State of the African Diaspora created a Royal Chamber, led by Reine Aidji, Minister of Historical Legacy of SOAD, and Chief Charumbira, President of the Parliament of the African Union.
